It was great to be able to walk some of the coastal paths and see the beautiful scenery in that part of the world.

Please pray for us as we are hoping for the opportunity to encourage others to partner with us in the work that we're doing in the task of Bible translation.

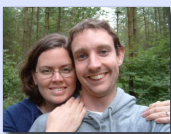
